

DLA Distinguished Civilian Service Award (For Private Citizens/Organization)

The DLA Distinguished Civilian Service Award is the highest DLA recognition for public service.

The Visual Communications and Market Media/Exhibit Services at HQ DLA will provide plaques for the DLA Distinguished Civilian Service Award.

Award Eligibility: This award, represented by a plaque and a citation certificate, may be awarded to private citizens or organizations rendering distinguished service of major significance to DLA.

Distinguished Service is described as:

- Exemplary service in an advisory capacity to a DOD/DLA committee, program, or project
- Direct assistance to DLA through actions or useful ideas which are beneficial in eliminating or minimizing problems or otherwise contributing to mission accomplishment
- Assistance through the cooperative use of facilities, equipment, or manpower
- Courageous or heroic actions in support of a DLA activity or mission, or other actions resulting in significant benefits to DLA

Award Submission: Honorary awards to the public shall not be granted routinely to successive individuals or organizations performing the same service. Nominations may be made by anyone having direct knowledge of a contribution by an individual or organization to the DLA mission. To be eligible for consideration, nominations should be submitted within six months of the act or service being recognized. The Director, DLA, may grant exceptions to this limitation. Nominations requiring HQ DLA approval should be submitted at least 30 days prior to anticipate presentation.

Award Approval by: Authority for its issuance is reserved to the Director, DLA.
