Program Length	Intermittent residencies span September/October through May
Location	The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill's Paul J. Rizzo Conference Center, Chapel Hill, North Carolina
Funding	Tuition is currently \$35,705 which includes materials, and lodging, and meals during academic residencies. Lodging and meals are not included during the corporate residency. Nominating organizations are responsible for funding tuition and associated travel and per diem. Average travel and per diem costs are estimated at \$10,000 to \$15,000.
Course Dates	Course dates for 2013-2014 are not yet available. (Dates for 2012 are listed below for reference only.) The program spans September/October 2013 through May 2014, with intermittent academic and corporate residencies. Course Description	<p>The LOGTECH DAELP is an executive development program serving the commanders and senior civilian leaders of our Nation's Depot and Arsenal facilities. In addition to increasing skills and knowledge on supply chain management, DAELP exposes students to leading edge business processes and practices that can be implemented immediately. DAELP provides a strategic leadership framework and overview of key functional, analytical, and managerial elements upon which effective organizational performance is built.</p> <p>Benefits of participation include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Extensive networking within the DoD industrial base• Opportunities to educate non-DLA participants on DLA services and how DLA supports the warfighter• Gaining a better understanding of customer challenges and needs from their perspective• Benchmarking—business, operations, logistics, supply chain management, forecasting, and demand planning• Corporate residencies enable participants to meet individual and organizational learning objectives from within materiel support, distribution, and supply sectors of DLA• Cross-fertilization of knowledge and expertise benefits both the Agency and customer

DAELP incorporates leadership, business process improvement tools and techniques, manufacturing, logistics and operations management while providing MBA level business acumen and education tailored to a Defense industrial base audience. Curriculum includes business and financial management, demand planning and forecasting, and integration of information and decision support systems. DAELP integrates leadership development and management concepts with multiple delivery methods (traditional classroom teaching in residence, online learning, business study tours, and corporate residencies).

Between residencies, participants return to their duty station. During the program, each participant conducts a worksite process improvement project that allows application of concepts learned in the workplace, especially Lean and Six Sigma concepts that culminate in a Lean Six Sigma Champion Certification and certificate from North Carolina State University (NCSU)—online instruction/assessments and in-residence practicum.

Initially designed in 2003 for U.S. Army Materiel Command leaders, DAELP has expanded in scope and stature to include participation from each Service, military industrial complex, Department of Homeland Security, and select DoD agencies. DAELP recently expanded inclusion of private sector executives with competence in operations, manufacturing, logistics, and supply chain management. AMC is the DoD Executive Agent for LOGTECH. DAELP is delivered in partnership with the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, and administered by the Institute for Defense and Business.

DAELP CORPORATE RESIDENCY

Participants are placed with leading private sector firms and paired with senior executive mentors. Participants have the opportunity to interact with executives and managers in a variety of businesses that result in a comprehensive view of private sector business operations. - Continuous Learning (*annotated on DAELP graduation certificate*)
 - Approximately 200 Continuous Learning Points (DAU Acquisition Professional certified)
 - 14 Continuing Education Units from UNC-CH KBS
 - 14 Engineering Professional Development Hours from NCSU
- DoD-level Continued Service Agreement (CSA) is required for three times the length of the training period

The DLA Executive Resources Board reviews nominations and makes the selection decision at the Agency level. Army Materiel Command, as the LOGTECH Executive Agent, makes the final selection decision.
